As such, the ESDW aims to raise awareness for the 2030 Agenda in Europe and calls upon local stakeholders to actively engage with sustainable development, in general, and the SDGs, in particular.

Marine Expeditions for Climate

Marine expeditions have always filled the public imagination with discoveries and technological exploits. Nowadays, they play a crucial role in the understanding of climate change and of its effects on our ecosystems. This conference aims at highlighting three major expeditions that are contributing to the research on sustainability in different ways: Tara, a polar schooner which has been travelling across the oceans since 2007 and advancing research on the protection of the environment ; Energy Observer, world's first hydrogen vessel, which has been nominated as "French ambassador of the Sustainable Development Goals"; and MOSAIC, the largest-scale Arctic research expedition of all time, which will start in September 2019 with the German research icebreaker Polarstern. All these major research and development projects call for a sustainable development and spread a message in favor of the protection of the oceans and of the climate. So get on board!

Ecological Footprints - Untamed Romania

The closing evening in the Embassy of Romania will offer to the guests **3 moments**:

1 – The ecological footprint by country

A walk-in infomap presented by its creator, Dr. Raimar Heber, Art Director at the dpainfografik in Berlin and Country Coordinator Germany of the SND/DACH.

Different countries have different characteristics: shape, area, topography, population, income, trade relations, etc. To visualize this in a way that's easy to comprehend, the countries are colored. This type of representation is called a choropleth map. It needs a scale, a legend that explains the colors.

When a country's size isn't relevant anymore, the data is easier to compare. This type of visualization is called Equal Area Cartogram Maps. Shown is the ecological footprint. The ecological footprint measures the consumption of all resources (including energy, nutrition, waste) that a person needs in everyday life. The ecological footprint calculates how much space is required for this in global hectares per capita (gha). The values of the ecological footprint are shown by height.

The colors help to intuitively perceive a classification from low to high. On top of the columns you can find additional information such as population, area and the flag of the respective country

About the Designer:

Dr. Raimar Heber (born 1957) is the Art Director at the dpainfografik in Berlin and Country Coordinator Germany of the SND/DACH. He studied product design and got into infographics via stations like advertising and industry design. In addition to his many years of working for the news agency, he is a speaker on topics of visual communication, communication design and infographics. He is enthusiastic about perspective, quick sketching and narrative portrayal, and recently also the 3D maps.

2- Documentary film presentation:

Untamed Romania - Secrets to be shared, stories to be told, narrated (in English) by Mark Strong

The documentary is a 90-minute journey into the fabulous natural life in Romania, beyond the commotion of the cities, unbeknownst to anyone, millions of plants and animals put on a show filled with splendor, grace, ferocity, candour and humour. The film presents the Carpathian Mountains, the Danube Delta and Transylvania as its major areas of interest.

The images are breathtaking, the scientific information about the flora and the fauna is well-dosed, and the music has been specially composed for the film. These are the things that explain the unusual success of the production released in 2018. Shot in the some of the most biodiverse places in Europe, the documentary helps the public see differently a continent that we thought we knew everything about.
